Red Day of Service To Brigadoon.

Brigadoon is thrilled to announce that Keller Williams Realty is donating their 3rd annual, 2011 Red Day of Service to Brigadoon. Every year each Keller Williams office sets aside a day of community service called Red Day, and donates their time to a local non-profit.

On Thursday, May 12, the entire Keller Williams office in Bellingham will donate their day at the Brigadoon property, painting the exterior of the new training building, repainting the office/kennel exterior, touching up the interior walls and painting the dog kennel interior. They will also be installing and moving fencing, clearing brush, weeding and general cleanup of the grounds.

Then Denise put me to work. I started learning how to work with the dogs on basic commands - I was feeling proud of my "good intentions". Training put me with the dogs and I really liked it. It was what I wanted to do. However, I found that training wasn't the best that I could do for Brigadoon. My skills as a graphic designer and writer could benefit the program in other ways - working on the Brigadoon brochures, the newsletter and other marketing materials. It isn't as much fun as working with the dogs, but

it isn't about me. It is about the Service Dogs and their partners. It is about taking action where you are most needed.

This is where I would like to call all of our readers to action and to challenge us all to do more for Brigadoon. As you may know, it takes up to \$30,000 to raise and train a dog for service. Right now Brigadoon doesn't bring in donations to cover the eleven dogs they currently have, let alone the potential to have more dogs. We also need to hire more trainers and our expenses raise every year.

How can you help? Donate your time to plan and hold a fund-raiser, help write grants, sponsor a dog (you can name it too), volunteer to plan and attend the graduation in October, and bring all your friends to participate in the auctions, raise a service dog puppy, be a spokesperson for Brigadoon at the functions you attend and ask for donations. Figure out what you are good at and see if you can turn it into cash for Brigadoon. If you have an idea - ACT.

The dogs are busy, now it is up to us to get busy too.
